

How to register in the ESC website



Please follow the next steps:

1. Go to https://europa.eu/youth/solidarity_en and then click on “join the corps” on the bottom of the page

The young people who participate in the European Solidarity Corps will all agree with and uphold its [Mission and Principles](#).

You can register for the European Solidarity Corps when you are 17 years old, but you cannot start a project until you are over 18. European Solidarity Corps projects will be available to people up to the age of 30 years old.

After completing a simple registration process, European Solidarity Corps participants could be selected and invited to join a wide range of projects, such as helping to prevent natural disasters or rebuild afterwards, assisting in centres for asylum seekers, or addressing different social issues in communities.

Projects supported by the European Solidarity Corps can last from two to twelve months. They will usually be located within the European Union Member States.






Passwords cannot include your username and must contain at least 10 characters chosen from at least three of the following four character groups (white space permitted):

- Upper Case: A to Z
- Lower Case: a to z
- Numeric: 0 to 9
- Special Characters: !#\$%&'()*+,-./:;<=>@[!]*_{}~


Before you continue, please answer the following questions to confirm that you agree with and will uphold the [Mission and Principles of the European Solidarity Corps](#), and that you are eligible to join the European Solidarity Corps.

You can register for the European Solidarity Corps when you are 17 years old, but you cannot start an activity until you have reached 18. Also, you must not be older than 30 at the start of the activity.

Also you must be legally resident in the EU Member States or one of the following countries:


- Republic of North Macedonia and Turkey
- Liechtenstein, Iceland and Norway
- Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo, Montenegro, Serbia
- Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Moldova, Ukraine
- Algeria, Egypt, Israel, Jordan, Lebanon, Libya, Morocco, Palestine, Syria, Tunisia

7. Don't forget to **scroll down** and go to the end of the page and accept the conditions and enter your date of birth, your country and click on **continue**:


9. Scroll down and enter your availability:
